**FULL COMMITTEE ACTION**

**Committee on Energy and Commerce**

**Thursday, May 21, 2009**

The Committee on Energy and Commerce met in open markup session to continue consideration of H.R. 2454, the American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009. The following actions were taken by the Committee:

Mr. Markey moved that H.R. 2454, the American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009, be ordered favorably reported to the House, amended, by a roll call vote: 33 – 25.

The amendment in the nature of a substitute to H.R. 2454, offered by Mr. Waxman and Mr. Markey, # 1, on May 18, 2009, was adopted, amended, by a voice vote.
