Dear Mr. Renwick:

The Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations of the Committee on Energy and Commerce is examining persistent consumer complaints of sudden unintended acceleration in vehicles manufactured by Toyota Motor Corporation, and the response by Toyota and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to those and other complaints lodged by Toyota drivers in recent years. According to a report in today's *Washington Post*, State Farm Insurance has alerted NHTSA "numerous" times since 2007 about an unusually high number of accidents attributed to sudden unintended acceleration in Toyota vehicles.<sup>1</sup> We are interested in learning whether your company has issued similar warnings to the agency. To assist the Committee with its investigation, we request that Progressive Group produce the following documents:

1. Any reports, briefings, or presentations provided by Progressive to NHTSA concerning defect trends in Toyota vehicles since 2000; and,
2. Any communications, including e-mail, to or from NHTSA related to any such reports, briefings, or presentations.




