

**AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE  
TO H.R. 2818  
OFFERED BY M . \_\_\_\_\_**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

**1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Methamphetamine  
3 Education, Treatment, and Hope Act of 2010”.

**4 SEC. 2. ENHANCING HEALTH CARE PROVIDER AWARENESS  
5 OF METHAMPHETAMINE ADDICTION.**

6 Section 507(b) of the Public Health Service Act (42  
7 U.S.C. 290bb(b)) is amended—

8 (1) by redesignating paragraphs (13) and (14)  
9 as paragraphs (14) and (15), respectively; and

10 (2) by inserting after paragraph (12) the fol-  
11 lowing:

12 “(13) collaborate with professionals in the ad-  
13 diction field and primary health care providers to  
14 raise awareness about how to—

15 “(A) recognize the signs of a substance  
16 abuse disorder; and

17 “(B) apply evidence-based practices for  
18 screening and treating individuals with or at-

1 risk for developing an addiction, including ad-  
2 diction to methamphetamine or other drugs;”.

3 **SEC. 3. RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAMS FOR PREG-**  
4 **NANT AND PARENTING WOMEN.**

5 Section 508 of the Public Health Service Act (42  
6 U.S.C. 290bb-1) is amended—

7 (1) in subsection (a)—

8 (A) in the matter preceding paragraph (1),  
9 by striking “postpartum women treatment for  
10 substance abuse” and inserting “parenting  
11 women treatment for substance abuse (includ-  
12 ing treatment for addiction to methamphet-  
13 amine)”;

14 (B) in paragraph (1), by striking “reside  
15 in” and inserting “reside in or receive out-  
16 patient treatment services from”; and

17 (C) in paragraph (2), by striking “the  
18 minor children of the women reside with the  
19 women in such facilities” and inserting “the  
20 minor children of the women who reside in such  
21 facilities reside with such women”;

22 (2) in subsection (d), by amending paragraph  
23 (2) to read as follows:

24 “(2) Referrals for necessary hospital and dental  
25 services.”;

1           (3) by amending subsection (m) to read as fol-  
2           lows:

3           “(m) ALLOCATION OF AWARDS.—In making awards  
4           under subsection (a), the Director shall give priority to  
5           any entity that agrees to use the award for a program  
6           serving an area that—

7           “(1) is a rural area, an area designated under  
8           section 332 by the Administrator of the Health Re-  
9           sources and Services Administration as a health pro-  
10          fessional shortage area with a shortage of mental  
11          health professionals, or an area determined by the  
12          Director to have a shortage of family-based sub-  
13          stance abuse treatment options; and

14          “(2) is determined by the Director to have high  
15          rates of addiction to methamphetamine or other  
16          drugs.”;

17          (4) in subsection (p)—

18                 (A) by striking “October 1, 1994” and in-  
19                 serting “one year after the date of the enact-  
20                 ment of the Methamphetamine Education,  
21                 Treatment, and Hope Act of 2010” ;

22                 (B) by inserting “In submitting reports  
23                 under this subsection, the Director may use  
24                 data collected under this section or other provi-  
25                 sions of law, insofar as such data is used in a

1 manner consistent with all Federal privacy laws  
2 applicable to the use of data collected under  
3 this section or other provision, respectively.”  
4 after “biennial report under section 501(k).”;  
5 and

6 (C) by striking “Each report under this  
7 subsection shall include” and all that follows  
8 and inserting “Each report under this sub-  
9 section shall, with respect to the period for  
10 which the report is prepared, include the fol-  
11 lowing:

12 “(1) A summary of any evaluations conducted  
13 under subsection (o).

14 “(2) Data on the number of pregnant and par-  
15 enting women in need of, but not receiving, treat-  
16 ment for substance abuse. Such data shall include,  
17 but not be limited to, the number of pregnant and  
18 parenting women in need of, but not receiving, treat-  
19 ment for methamphetamine abuse, disaggregated by  
20 State and tribe.

21 “(3) Data on recovery and relapse rates of  
22 women receiving treatment for substance abuse  
23 under programs carried out pursuant to this section,  
24 including data disaggregated with respect to treat-  
25 ment for methamphetamine abuse.”;

1           (5) by redesignating subsections (q) and (r) as  
2           subsections (r) and (s), respectively;

3           (6) by inserting after subsection (p) the fol-  
4           lowing:

5           “(q) METHAMPHETAMINE ADDICTION.—In carrying  
6           out this section, the Director shall expand, intensify, and  
7           coordinate efforts to provide pregnant and parenting  
8           women treatment for addiction to methamphetamine or  
9           other drugs.”; and

10          (7) in subsection (s) (as so redesignated), by  
11          striking “such sums as may be necessary to fiscal  
12          years 2001 through 2003” and inserting  
13          “\$16,000,000 for fiscal year 2012, \$16,500,000 for  
14          fiscal year 2013, \$17,000,000 for fiscal year 2014,  
15          and \$17,500,000 for fiscal year 2015, and  
16          \$18,000,000 for fiscal year 2016”.

17 **SEC. 4. WORKPLACE INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE.**

18          Section 515(b) of the Public Health Service Act (42  
19          U.S.C. 290bb–21(b)) is amended—

20          (1) in paragraph (10), by striking “and” at the  
21          end;

22          (2) by redesignating paragraph (11) as para-  
23          graph (13); and

24          (3) by inserting after paragraph (10) the fol-  
25          lowing new paragraph:
