District by District Impact of H.R. 1076, Legislation to Prohibit Federal Funding for NPR and the Use of Federal Funds to Acquire Radio Content

On March 17, 2011, Congress will vote on H.R. 1076, legislation to prohibit federal funding of National Public Radio and the use of Federal funds to acquire radio content. The House Rules Committee met on an “emergency” basis to consider this legislation on March 16, 2011.

This legislation would have a significant impact on public radio stations across the country, eliminating all funding for NPR through the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). Hundreds of stations rely on CPB funding as a major source of funding, especially rural stations and minority stations. Prohibiting the use of CPB funds to purchase popular NPR programming will make it difficult for stations to attract local listeners and raise funds for the production of local content and station operations.

Because the legislation did not go through the normal Committee process, there have been no hearings, testimony, or expert review, and members might have little information about the impact of this legislation. This analysis provides, on a district by district basis, information about how the legislation will affect public radio stations.

Overall, this analysis, which focuses on public radio stations that receive CPB grants, finds that prohibiting the use of federal funds to purchase radio content would negatively impact 414 stations across the country. These stations serve listening areas in 280 congressional districts in all 50 states. They provide a total of 7,800 jobs.

There are many congressional districts that are at risk of major disruption under H.R. 1076. In Alaska, represented by Rep. Don Young, there are 26 public radio stations that receive federal grants. These stations received over \$5 million in grants from the CPB in 2009. In Colorado’s third Congressional District, represented by Rep. Scott Tipton, there are ten stations at risk. These stations received almost \$1.3 million in grants from the CPB in 2009. There are 32 congressional districts that are served by public radio stations that received over \$1 million in federal funds in 2009, and 247 congressional districts served by public radio stations that received over \$100,000 in federal funds in 2009.

Details on all congressional districts served by public radio stations that received over \$100,000 in 2009 can be seen in Table 1.
